#### **THE STEWARDSHIP OF LENT**

*Merciful Lord, as we prepare for our journey of renewal toward the great paschal feast of Easter, teach us to be good stewards of your mercy and forgiveness, so that we may extend these gifts to others. Give us the strength to bear witness to you at all times, even in times of stress and adversity. And fill our hearts with love that we may be faithful to the Gospel Jesus proclaimed and ready to celebrate His resurrection. Grant this through Our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.*

This weekend, we are nearing the halfway point of the Lenten Season. Lent prepares us for the most holy of the Catholic Church's Holy Days, the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday.

Lent is the season that the church has set aside to deliberately reflect on our relationship with Our Lord, other people and even ourselves. We should examine our souls and seek ways to bring us closer to Him and to others. In preparation, the Church encourages us to reflect regularly on the suffering death that Jesus endured. It was through His suffering and crucifixion that we have been given the opportunity for eternal life.

The traditional disciplines of Lent are fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. Fasting not only involves giving up meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays, but also voluntarily "giving up," or abstaining, in any of the enjoyable activities of our daily lives. We truly thank Our Lord when the fasting and abstaining we do is for His sake, as in when we do this in memory of the suffering He endured for us.

We are also called to deepen our spiritual lives through prayer. This we do by attending Mass, reading the Bible or inspirational writings, attending our RHCC Monday evening retreats, Stations of the Cross and personal prayer. These we can do as we seek forgiveness and reconciliation with God.

Almsgiving is often given the least attention of the traditional Lenten disciplines. However, we find that our Bible puts a firm emphasis on it. "Prayer and fasting are good, but better

than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness...It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life" (Tobit 12:8-9).

If you find it difficult to "give up" things for Lent, try "doing" things for Lent. Read your Bible and keep it close by so it is easy to reach. Attend as many as you can of the Lenten services our RHCC has scheduled. Make a short-term pledge to increase your Lenten/Easter Season donations. Use your Church envelopes. Be a regular contributor if you are not one already. Increase your weekly donation by a dollar or more. Make a commitment to fill your Rice Bowl with change you have saved. Donate to the Red Cross or other charities. Make a commitment to volunteer your time at least once this Lenten or Easter season for our RHCC or other community event. It is Lent and your time for stewardship.

In order for our Catholic Community to thrive, we need everyone's support-spiritually and financially. The infrastructure of our faith and of our Catholic Community calls for each of us to live holy and generous lives. If you truly love Our Lord, be proactive and savor the remaining Lenten season by becoming the best Steward of Lent you can be.
